August

- **SPROUTS** Sprouts Kids Club at the PCFM features from Farm to Lunchbox to promote local food. We average 25 kiddos for Sprouts who receive 5 \$1 tokens to purchase helath & nutrition items.
- KALP 40 We celebrated 40 years of leadership with over 200 guests in Lexington for the Kentucky Ag Leadership Program. I'm honored to be a graduate of Class XII of this amazing program that made me a better leader.
- Woodland Owners Short Course Field Day Pendleton County was on full display as we welcomed 90
 forest land owners from across the state for a field day and woodland extravaganza. A great
 partnership with numerous agencies whom provide resources for woodland management.
- Tractor Driving at the KY State Fair Another great year at the Kentucky State Fair as Waylon Clifton and Mitchell Ryan brought home awards in both lawn tractor and tractor driving events for our 4-H Youth.
- **KYFB LEAD** Our 4th session of the KYFB Leadership progarm took place in Louisville. I held a \$10 million ham at the Annual Ham Breakfast!!!

Hey y'all! I'm Lilyana Miller








SPOTTED LANTERN FLY

Tree of Heaven is a fast-growing invasive tree that spreads aggressively and outcompetes native plants. It gives off a foul odor and supports the lifecycle of the harmful Spotted Lanternfly. Cut them down and stump treat with appropriate herbicide.



The Spotted Lanternfly is an invasive insect that feeds on trees and crops, causing damage and spreading mold. It relies on Tree of Heaven to reproduce and threatens agriculture and forests. It feeds on over 70 plant species.
